MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE ALMSHOUSE.

This day, August 27th, 1770, a meeting of the Board of Directors of the Almshouse was held in the office of that institution, having been called by Rev. Father Dagobert for the purpose of receiving the report of the Administrators and Treasurer on the management and handling of funds and to elect an Administrator in place of Mr. Denis Braud, whose term had expired.

The report of Mr. Braud was referred to Messrs. Louis Ranson and Gilbert Maxent, a committee of two, to be examined, after which they shall report to his Lordship, the Governor, and to Rev. Father Dagobert thereon.

Considering the zealous work performed by Mr. Braud, during his Administration, for the benefit of the Almshouse, the Board of Directors asked him to continue in the same functions for three additional years, which he presently and willingly accepted, being pleased to learn that he had been useful in such pious and salutary work.

Mr. Braud submitted a report showing in the clearest manner possible the present financial condition of the institution and the urgent necessity of collecting the rent of the house occupied by the Capuchins, which is due by the inhabitants. After he had read same in a loud and audible voice, it was resolved to

submit the matter to his Excellency, the Governor,
and to plead with him to take the most suitable
means of engaging the inhabitants to pay said
rent.

There being no other business before the Board
the meeting adjourned and they have signed with
me, Notary.

Report of Messrs. Braud and Durand.

PROPOSITIONS SUBMITTED
BY THE ADMINISTRATORS
OF THE ALMSHOUSE
TO THE MEETING OF THE
BOARD OF DIRECTORS HELD
"THIS DAY" FOR THEIR CONSIDERATION
AND RESOLUTIONS THEREON.

Messieurs:

The necessity of providing suitable quarters for an office led us since the meeting of April 2nd last, to undertake the construction of the building in which you are at present. The moderate cost and the absolute necessity of a place in which to hold our monthly meetings have been the motives for our undertaking and we seek, Messieurs, and hope for your approval.

One of the sides of the main building of the Hospital seemed to us to be sinking; the necessity of bracing it as well as the floor of the sick-ward, through which daylight could be seen, (that defect being necessarily detrimental to the patients); the need of a girder to be passed under said building to support the joists, which yielded under the feet and impo-rtuned the patients as much as their illness; the unevenness of said floor, as well as that of the chapel, part of which consists of "crouttes"; the condition of the posts supporting the steeple damaged at their bases and having lost their support; all those motives led us to buy 300 planks from Sr. Lery and 180 from Sr. Jacquelin to serve as much for said repairs to the ward and chapel as to aid in the daily needs of the hospital. We would rightly have hesitated to have this work done without being

authorized thereunto by a resolution, if as we continue to observe, the moderate cost of labor had not influenced us. The work of repairing the Almshouse has been going on for exactly 60 days. The workers have averaged ten per day and the cost has amounted only to 109 (livres) for the carpenters and 72 livres for the roofers, which averages 6 sols per laborer each day. Messieurs, may it be resolved that the whole matter has your approval, as well as the purchase of 36 pieces of wood of 8/9 _____ of 20 and 22 _____ (document torn), bought from Sr. Montreuil at 4 sols per foot, some of which were employed in building the Board of Directors' room.

Sr. Roussillon having made a donation to said Almshouse of a lot of about 2000 pickets, which he had at the German settlement, above the Church, we represent, Messieurs, that Sr. Clermont undertook to haul same at the rate of 225 livres 15 sols per load but when the pickets to be hauled had been reduced to 1516, Sr. Clermont kindly ceased to charge for the loads and reduced the cost by 25 livres, leaving a net cost of 200 livres for the pickets, which sum was paid to Sr. Clermont; we request that said transaction be approved as just and reasonable by resolution of the Board.

We represent to you, Messieurs, that the fortifications built in this city in 1760 having taken away from the Almshouse the greater portion of the lot which it occupied, it has since then been so crowded and confined that there has been no room for the convalescents to take the air or have any recreation. To permit them to leave the enclosure facilitates their going to town, where it has often happened that they have eaten

fruit or other food injurious to them in their convalescence. That abuse having appeared important to us and onerous to the Almshouse by reason of relapses of said patients, we forbade them, on the advice of Sieurs Roussillon and Montegut to go out, but they are too closely confined, and we are not able to give them the freedom of the gardens, on account of the plants, which they will be tempted to eat, and which might conflict with their diet.

It would be meet to beg of Messrs. Aubry and Foucault, Commandant and Intendant of this Province, to permit the extension of the hospital ground, to be marked by a picket fence; that extension might be made on the side opposite to the garden and might measure 2 arpents front. It would cause no hardship, as, in an emergency, it would be easier to take down the fence than to erect it. That extension cannot be made elsewhere. The hospital faces the city drainage ditch; it is bounded on its right side by a similar ditch, and in the rear by the fortifications. It is only on the side mentioned that the extension of the area may be made and a fence erected, its location to be determined as follows: beginning at the foot of the Board of Directors' office to the said 2-arpent portion where a large entrance gate may be placed, almost adjoining said office and opposite Toulouse Street. This gate will open to a width of 10 feet inside, ornamented with an iron capital, six feet high, the cross above it to measure two feet in height. At the bottom will be written "Hospital de Charite" and on the knob "J H C". These objects requiring indispensable expenditures may be obtained at very little cost. The bricks needed for the gate pillars were donated by Sr. Gayarro, "contador"; the labor on the capital was paid by Sieurs Roussillon and Montegut; the balance of the costs will therefore amount only to a sum between 80 and 100 livres for

about 400 or 500 pounds of iron which is obtainable at 20 livres per hundred weight. The cost of the masonry may be donated. The zeal which in the last few months has animated charitable souls, and the benefactions which have resulted in favor of the Almshouse, lead us to hope that in the present need some one will be generous enough to offer to defray the expenses.

The Almshouse being situated on the site serving as commons to the City, great inconvenience is occasioned to that building of said institution used as a chapel; between said building and the city drainage ditch is a passage for innumerable cattle and nanny-goats, which stop at that place; the former particularly in the evening annoy persons who go to the chapel to join in the prayers said at the Angelus; the latter enter the chapel during the day when no one is there. This passage, being useful only in case of emergency with regard to possible operations in connection with the fortifications, and the royal road between the ditch and the end of the city lots having been opened for the traffic of supplies, it would be equally proper to request the Commandant and Intendant to permit that the front fence of said hospital be placed on the outer edge of the ditch and that at each extremity, the fence should join the fortifications, subject, however, to being raised in the event that the service of the King should require it.

The ceiling of the office of the Board of Directors has just been painted, through the double generosity of Messrs. Montegut and Roussillon; it seems equally proper to paint the hospital chapel. The veneration due the place, the assembly of the faithful in the faith of Jesus Christ, imploring there daily His mercy, leads us to hope

The sick-ward, in order to maintain cleanliness, likewise would require painting. "Spanish White", mixed with gum, would be sufficient. Only the labor would be more costly. We leave these dispositions to your discretion.

INTESTATE SUCCESSION OF LUIS
DUCRET.

Proceedings instituted by the heirs of the deceased Luis Ducret for the purpose of making an inventory, appraisal, and partition of the properties left by said deceased.

The widow of the deceased petitioned the court that her husband's estate be adjudicated to her at the price of the appraisement in the inventory and further that when so adjudicated she will sell the same and divide it if the proceeds should be sufficient to cover her dowry of 19,147 Pesos which her husband received as it is evident by the marriage contract presented, the money she has spent for mourning, the funeral expenses and the house rent paid by her since her husband's death.

Touton Beauregard, curator of the Ducret minor heirs, answers the widow's application, alleging that inasmuch as the inventory values aggregate only 8398 pesos, 5 reales and clearly insufficient to cover Mrs. Ducret's dowry of 19,145 pesos stating that under the circumstance the widow be satisfied with the restoration of the dowry as diminished.

Ducros, defender of the absent heirs of Mason, petitioned the court that the sale of the estate of the deceased would be the only

test to establish whether it would bring an amount sufficient to pay the dowry and the debts of the decedent, alleging that Mrs. Ducret's dowry which was 95,735 livres is now only worth 51,503 livres, 8 sols, due to the monetary reduction caused by several Royal decrees issued by the Kingdom of France.

On December 19th, Governor Unzaga and Dr. Ordoardo, Assessor general, entered a judgment adjudicating to the widow her husband's estate at the price of the appraisement and requiring her to give bond therefore and also to give a sworn statement of the estate and an account of its affairs.

The widow complied with said judgment, and furnished the bond and surety, also an account of the estate, first having costs of the succession taxed, which are fixed by the assessor at 102 pesos, 6 reales. This accounting shows the net value of the estate of Ducret to be 48,301 livres, 10 sols, 10 deniers.

Plaintiff, representing Francisco Desmazellieres, through his Attorney Leonardo Mazange, instituted proceedings to compel the defendant to pay 2000 pounds of indigo of good quality as agreed per the attached Act of Sale by which Francois Dussiau de la Croix de Mazelliers (Desmazellieres) transfers a plantation 18 arpents wide by 80 arpents deep, 20 slaves, and all utensils and implements to the Defendant Mr. Joseph Chalon and his wife, Marie Elizabeth des Ruisseaux (Desruisseaux) for 30,000 livres in piastres gourdes to be paid by the widow Desruisseaux, with 2000 pounds of good commercial indigo, at the end of the 1770 harvest and other payments in 1771 and 1772. The plaintiff petitioned the court to issue a writ of execution in order to seize the properties of the defendant to satisfy said past due debt, its one-tenth and costs. On December 22nd, 1770, Governor Unzaga ordered the defendant to appear in court within four days. On January 9th, 1771, the sheriff Santiago Hallays declared before the Notary Clerk of the Cabildo that he had notified the defendant to appear in court as per the decree of His Excellency the Governor.

On February 12th, 1770, plaintiff petitioned the court to issue a writ of execution as the defendant has failed to appear in court, as ordered. The court rendered a judgment by default in favor of the plaintiff and ordered the defendant to pay within three days the 2000 pounds of indigo.

On June 25th, 1770, Francisco des Mazellieres takes the case out of his agents hands and through his attorney Leonardo Mazange, petitions the court to issue a second notice

(cont'd)

of citation to the defendant as the Court Clerk has been unable to notify the defendant because of his absence. The court granted the plaintiff's petition and ordered the defendant to appear within three days. On June 25th, 1770, the sheriff Santiago Hallays appeared before the Notary Clerk of the Cabildo and stated that he had notified the defendant as per the decree of the court. On July 5th, 1770, the plaintiff again petitioned the Court to issue a writ of execution alleging that the defendant has not complied with the payment of the 2000 pounds of indigo as ordered by the Court. The Court granted the plaintiff's petition and ordered a writ of execution to be issued against the properties of the defendant to cover the value of 2000 pounds of indigo and the expenses of these proceedings. On Oct. 9th, 1770 the sheriff appeared before Juan B. Garric, Notary Clerk of the Cabildo and stated that he had gone to the defendant's plantation with said writ of execution and asked the defendant to pay the 2000 pounds of indigo which he failed to do. The defendant was then asked to produce some property so that he might carry out the decree of the court and that the defendant failed to comply with said request and that he proceeded to seize 4 barrels of indigo totally weighing 785 pounds and placed said seized property in the hands of the General Receiver which is now at the disposition of the Court.

On Feb. 25th, the plaintiff petitioned the Court to return the original act of sale and to have the Court Clerk make an itemized statement of the expense of these proceedings and to charge said expenses to the defendant, who on Feb. 26th, agreed to pay said expenses. On Feb. 27th, the Court sent to the Assessor General the Plaintiff's petition to close the case and the defendant's acceptance to pay said expenses

and the Assessor ruled: "That with the consent of the two litigants the suit is cancelled. Let the original documents be returned to the plaintiff, the defendant to pay costs." The expenses amounted to 47 pesos.
