YEAR 1779

THE CAPTURE OF THE FORT OF BATON ROUGE.

By Sieur Bernado de Galvez.

Poem by Julian Poydras, 1779.

What crash, what noise comes knocking in my ear?

I slumbered, when all of a sudden the thunder-bolt wakened me, and its redoubled strokes caused me to see my waters murmuring, my palace trembling, and hear resounding echoes.

What mortal or what god cometh here, and with his rage to disturb the double peace of my happy shores?

Where, under my wise laws, my cherished dwellers spent their happiest days without care or anxiety; precious subjects of my attention, they saw abundance anticipating their wants forever with affluence.

With genuine well-being, they tasted of the comforts of life; the superfluities never reached their hearts; they knew not the meaning of discord and of war, or other scourges that ravage the earth.

In the bosom of my waters they found their fish; game in the wood-land, the reed-grass for their home; to quench their thirst, I gave my purest waves, and for their rest the prettiest greens.

Their bows and their arrows are gifts from my hands, and to me alone they owed their happiness and well-being,

They lived content under my happy rule, when alas, a daring mortal! Let us see what inspired him?

Charming Sesaris, leave! Fly to yonder place whence I hear so much noise - that dreadful thunder-bolt!

There, with watchful eye, a man in disguise, and with tender care, seizes the whole affair.

"Come bring me tidings of it all. I wish to know if some intrepid man is seeking my power, sayeth he:"

and Sesaris, like a bolt, split the waves, and shaking her hair, saw the light of the world. Under the darts of a Martel, she advanced toward the camp, and there recognized the hero with triumphant air. She listens to his speeches and sees the entire army, and the longing of each for a lively combat. He is crowned with success. The enemy could be seen along the ramparts; conquered, they brandished their standards. Gratified, she leaves to again plunge into the waves and visit the god in his grotto of the deep. On his throne of old, meditating, he awaited her. On his hand sadly rested his head. His spirit broken and wasting away with worry, he could see but fire and flame. Surrounded by fish-spears, these in vain sought to bolster up his wandering thoughts. Nothing seemed to move him, stunned as he was. Thus we see a mortal post lose his life. The gracious emissary returns from her battles. Seeing her, he said: "Come flying to my arms, my dear Seraris! oh, my dear nymph! Seeing you, what pleasure comes to gratify my wish. Let me know what misfortunes threaten our climates? What means have we to stop their controversy? You know what power I possess, and how supreme! The nymph replied with an air full of decency: "God of the Mississippi, terrible as you and your angry waves are, what power would dare oppose your blows?"

From North to South your empire stretches.

Enviously each nation your favors seeks, and at your commands one sees both banks give way.

Men, both good and stupid, and your angry rush of waters and heaping waves hasten their course.

The hosts of our woodland, affrighted with danger, though fleet-footed, can never escape it.

The waters in their fury rush to the hills, while their unfortunate inhabitants perish under their ruins.

For this time it seems, God ceases to limit your boundaries; hence my narrative has nothing that will enrage you.

I have seen the hero who brings you alarm; he
 seemed like a god clothed in full armor,
 His superb plume of feathers at the mercy of
 the winds, while his dishevelled hair as ornament
 to him served.

A noble and haughty profession proclaimed his
 daring; the heroic virtue sparkled his brow.

In one hand he held his glittering sword; with
 the other he held back his bouncing steed,

He led his beautiful cortage spiritedly, proud
 of the privilege to face with him the hazards of
 battle, seeking the dangers that would mark out
 their prowess.

The brave foot-soldiers followed them in a row
 under the boiling hot fire of both Mars and Bellane.

They marched in perfect order, sure-footed and
 hardy; scornful of the dangers, they advanced on the
 enemy.

Following them in their march could be seen, with-
 out stratagem, some of our proud inhabitants - the
 intrepid Milice, and their skilful hands which were
 tracing fields with the same ardor with which bas-
 tions were rising,

And making ditches and brest-works and trenches
 along with war machines and implements invented for
 warfare, while for the art of conquest they seem to
 have been born, and with this they carried terror
 into their brave enemy's camps.

To the ramparts they carried their courage, noth-
 ing made them safe from the effects of the rage.

The marching ceased with the men of color: Quick
 and spirited, they gave evidence of their sincerity.
 The intrepid Galvez encouraged them on every hand -
 his discourse, his countenance aroused them to
 slaughter.

However, all is in readiness; and first the Eng-
 lishman fires from their mouths of steel the murder-
 ous balls of lead.

Their shots, fired as soon as the thunder-bolt was
 hurled, struck and upset and everything was reduced
 to powder,

In vain, they light up anew their sparkling fires -
 nothing can disturb their brave besiegers.

In spite of the mortal darts which threatened their lives,

They stripped everything in sight, and set up their battery; the cannons are pointed; the impatient general fires the first, then gives the signal. He is followed at once, and their thunderbolt of war, headed straight for the enemy, discharges its deadly fire. He is upset, but returns their fire, and the combat, reanimated, becomes furious.

The battle is on: The Englishman, with increased courage, returns the fire with constant fury. He stood his ground, resisting their onslaught, but he later staggered under their heavier fire. These blasting cannon balls demolished their earthwork; death and desolation are everywhere leaving their traces. Weary of the futility of his battle, he no longer boasts of stopping their progress. He hoists the white flag of truce to scuff at his defeat. The army in camp, seeing him, exclaimed: "Victory is now won!" Victory that day snatched from the British those evergreen laurels which decorated our brows.

Galvez, victorious, masters his army. Delighted with the sentiments that have animated his men, he engaged them with this touching discourse, which was just like him: "Bold warriors, comrades of my glory, today at your hands I have won a victory. At Sparta you are seen flying to the victor's camp, and everywhere you display a signal value. You have left your comrades to follow in my footsteps; you have left your children of tender age, and your faithful wives. I realize what I owe you for your services and accomplishments, and I shall know how to sing your praises to the greatest of our kings. You may rely upon my justice and my gratitude. Your virtues shall be given their just reward. The rank of distinction they may see fit to bestow upon me shall carry no glory if it can divert the course of my favour, for I assure you that a more just division between us would bring me greater pleasure. With this he closed his discourse and everybody by unanimous acclamation assured him of their heartfelt approval.

Sesaris was relating, whilst the entire audience, God, nymphs and sea gods listened in silence - a secret joy was lodged in every heart, and all declared themselves in favor of the victors. She observed in their eyes a painted curiosity, and to them said: "Listen, I shall speak without fear. Alas, we now see them, those happier times - days that will bring us vast changes. The thorns and the reed-grass shall not disguise your fertile shore. Industrious planters by their toil shall convert our dreary deserts into most attractive places of abode. Our fields by their hands shall be cultivated year after year, and abundant crops shall be their yield. In our meadows we shall cover our little hills. Ceres, Pomone and Flore, as well as the graces in their native simplicity shall find enjoyment with us on our fertile shores.

The playful Zephyr with its light breeze shall blow open the flowers it loves to caress. Peace and plenty shall abide in our regions, where love and pleasure shall pay their lasting tribute. So long as this generous victor of a loving people shall continue to bestow all of this happiness. God, intervening him, gave vent to his joy: "I see him, he cried, it is heaven which has sent him. May he abide in the bosom of prosperity; - may he taste of the joy to see himself adored; may his noble qualities be everywhere proclaimed, and may his noble deeds earn their just rewards. I shall admonish my waters to moderate their currents, and to enrich their bordering land with paths of flowers that shall lead to glory. May his name be blessed in the temple of memory. Ye nymphs sing; sea-gods, blow your reed-pipes. In the empire of the seas, everything breathes happiness. In her honor I wish a feast declared forever dedicated to her new conquest.

The record shows that Juan Bautista Macarty, Pedro Surget, Nicolas Sarde, Pedro Portal and Antonio Jung, creditors of Joseph alias Juan Bautista Bichot filed a petition informing the Court that said Bichot had suddenly left this Province without settling his debts and had abandoned his house and belongings. Therefore for the security of their claims they asked the Court to have an inventory made of all the fugitive's properties and to confiscate them.

The Court granted the creditors' petition and the Judge himself proceeded to make the requested inventory in the presence of said creditors which disclosed that the fugitive owned various tools, some articles of clothing, provisions, household articles, furniture, one musket, etc., and 387 raw hides and one house and parcel of land situated on St. Peter Street. Once the inventory was concluded the Court placed the properties under the custody of Nicolas Fromentin who was appointed trustee.

The five above mentioned creditors and others who appeared afterwards filed their respective claim individually and then the said five creditors jointly asked the Court to proceed to the auction sale of the property, specifying that they had already arranged with Leonardo Mazange the sale of the hides which they

(cont'd)

requested be awarded to him at one peso for each ox hide, four reales for each deer hide and one real for each sheep hide. The Court granted this petition, the hides having been sold to Mazange and the other effects to various other persons, all of which yielded about 400 pesos. There were several hides which could not be sold because of their bad condition.

At this time appeared another creditor named Cadet Portal who filed a suit to recover the sum of 300 pesos which he claimed was due him as balance of the sum of 360 pesos for which he sold to Bichot the house appearing in the inventory. He presented as evidence the deed of sale and he asked the Court to order the auction sale of said house in order that his claim be satisfied in preference to the ones of the other creditors alleging that in accordance with law his was a privileged claim.

The Court granted Portal's petition, but the record is incomplete and does not show whether the house was sold nor whether any provisions were made to pay the creditors from the proceeds of the effects sold.

There is also a memorandum in Raymond Salget's writing of tools and merchandise received from the junior Mr. Sarde, May 25, 1778.

Thereupon the petitioner alleges that as it appears from the accounts he presents, Salger owes him 104 pesos, 5 reales, 1/2 maravedi. He asks that his effects be sold to pay this debt and that all the tools and articles that he rented to Salget be returned to him officially, since he is a fugitive from this Province, Judge Piernas grants this last request, and Nicolas Sarde receipts for his tools (dont'd) that are returned to him by the General

Receiver.

A letter is in the files, dated February 25, 1779, written by Delille Manemara claiming that there is due to him 14 pesos for the rental of a negro for more than six days, for the time that he acted as guardian. Judge Piernas rules to file this claim with the others.

Sarde then petitions that the property be sold at public auction without any other legal formalities as the amount is so small. Piernas orders the effects now in the hands of the General Receiver put on exhibition and sold as requested. The next day the public crier called the sale in the streets and accustomed places and the auction began. The articles offered were adjudicated to the highest bidders. After the sale there is a joint petition by Nicolas Sarde and Raymond Salget saying that they have composed their differences and they asked that the General Receiver return the rest of the products of the sale of the things that were seized. Judge Piernas rules: As it is prayed, the parties giving the receipt that is required. This receipt is signed by Nicolas Sarde and Raymund Salger, the latter receiving 39 pesos, the amount that remained with the General Receiver together with his papers. This proceedings ends the record.
