Sr. Jean Soubagne (sic), settler, residing at Chantilly, appeared at the Records Office and declared having acquired from a cargo of the Vessel "l'Aurore," a negro named Bivan, who was marooned several times, and yesterday at noon ran away. Informed of this by other negroes, declares followed him and finding him almost half-way from the city, sitting in a cane-field, fired to frighten him into submission; the negro, instead, ran into the depth of the wood; declarer making the circuit of same, found him, this time, thrown on the ground by a sugar-cane in his way, and threatened to shoot if he moved. The negro forced to surrender, was brought back and put in irons.

Mr. and Mrs. de la Goublais, having lodged a complaint of assault and insult against Mme. Coupart, an inquiry was held before Hon. Judge Prat of the Superior Council.

"Document scrawled and torn", but apparently all witnesses testified to like effect and only heresay evidence returned of Mme. Coupart sending a little boy to Mme. La Goublais to buy a pound of sugar, giving him a 25 livre note, the boy returning only 4 livres. Mme. Coupart went to Mme. la Goublais to rectify the error, but Mme la Goublais proved that the highest bill in her possession was five livres.
