Plaintiff declares that since the depositions of witnesses have been taken, Sr. Delachaise does not deny that an exchange of slaves took place,

but he merely says that plaintiff delayed too long in making his claim.

Plaintiff is willing to declare under oath that the negro has never rendered any service to him; that he took steps to protect his rights as soon as he learned of the deception; and that Sr. de Coustillas offered to exchange the negro for plaintiff (upon learning of the malversation). Plaintiff, however, preferred to have recourse to the Superior Council.
