There being nothing more certain than death and nothing more uncertain than the hour thereof; realizing that I am suffering from a disease dangerous to my body, but being sound of mind, I am glad to put my affairs in order, explaining my last wishes as I desire them to be carried out by my testamentary executor, who will hereinafter be appointed, no one having the right to oppose same, being of the age of majority, having neither father nor mother, the former having died when I was an infant, and my mother 13 years ago; moreover, what I own I earned in this country, without reproach.

Concerning what might fall to me in France, of whatever kind it may be, I have taken care of that matter and made proper disposition thereof.

I recommend my soul to God, the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, to the blessed Virgin Mary, to my Guardian Angel, to all the saints in Paradise, particularly to my holy patrons, begging them when my soul shall pass from this life into the other, to receive it among the elect. Amen.

I Give my soul to God, my body to the earth, begging my testamentary executor to have me buried simply. Prior to my funeral a requiem Mass shall be offered, during the offering of which, if there be other priests, low masses will be offered.

For the duration of a year, on each first Monday of the month there will be held a service for my intention in the Parochial Church and fifty low masses will be offered.

Item, I beg those whom I may have offended in any manner to deign to forgive me as I forgive.

I desire that my promissory notes or debts, if any exist, be discharged and paid by preference and priority.

Item, I give and bequeath to the Parochial Church 200 livres for the purchase of an ornament or improvement which my executor will please have placed, such as a large crucifix or other object according to his choice, which sum shall be paid and based on pressing needs.

Item, I give and bequeath to the deserving genteel poor of the city 200 livres, and 100 livres for the purchase of clothes for the most needy orphans.

After my debts shall have been paid and the above wishes shall have been carried out a sale shall be made of the property, the proceeds of which I give and bequeath with my small lot of ground, to serve in perpetuity in the foundation of a Hospital for the Sick of New Orleans, no one having the right to oppose this disposition made in order to provide things necessary to the care of the sick. I desire and

intend that said sale be made by my testamentary executor, to whom I leave the superintendence and direction of said Foundation for life, and I desire that he name his successor in anticipation of his death or absence from the Colony, to carry out my wishes.

I beg the rector of the parish to be kind enough to cooperate with my testamentary executor in the establishment of said hospital and in carrying out my wishes.

The present testament written with my own hand, while in full possession of all my mental faculties, revoking all wills and codicils which I may formerly have made, and which are to remain null and void; intending that the present will be executed according to its form and tenor and that it be rather too strictly enforced than neglected, relying on the good faith of my testamentary executor; and for the purpose of executing and fulfilling its conditions in their entirety I appoint Monsieur "Raguet" (Raguet), Councilor of the Superior Council of this Province, begging him to be kind enough to take charge thereof and to treat it as though it were something belonging to him, without obligation on his part to render an accounting to any one whomsoever, and without the supervision of an officer of justice, as I have entire confidence in his honesty and loyalty.


