The undersigned parties, having learned of the death of Sr. St. Julien, a retired Officer of the Navy, which occurred at 1.30 o'clock of the same morning, at the home of Sr. Aufrere, (his business partner), where he resided, repaired to said house for the purpose of obtaining from said Sr. Aufrere a declaration of the property left by decedent.

Sr. Aufrere declared that decedent had not left in the city any movables subject to seals, and Sr. d'Amyaut, Major of this place, finding none and having gone to said house for the purpose of affixing the seals, withdrew.

There were found belonging to decedent at said place a suit of clothes and two shirts in bad condition, some scrap iron, a chimney shovel and other household utensils, eight slaves, a mattress and a blanket.

Sr. Aufrere declared that decedent owned five slaves, who are across the Lake; that he had heard him mention five or six years ago that he owned about 50 head of cattle at Natchitoches; that he owned an abandoned plantation measuring 50 or 60

arpents, opposite Cannes Brulees; that some of the movable property of decedent is in other hands; that he does not know the exact status of decedent's business and that he intends to produce the account of the partnership which existed between them.

Sr. Fleuriau, Procurator General, represents that he has just learned of the death of Sr. de St. Julien, retired Captain, which occurred during the preceding night, at the home of Sr. Aufrere, his partner, where he resided; that he has left many slaves, a few head of cattle, an interest in a tar manufacturing plant, and many debts, the greater portion of which is due the Company of the Indies, and that he had no relatives in this Colony.

Wherefore the Procurator General prays that an order issue, directing that seals be affixed on the effects of said Succession, in the presence of the Agent of the Company of the Indies, the Administrator of Vacant Successions and any other claimants, for the conservation of the rights of absent heirs, creditors and all whom it may concern.

INVENTORY.

1. - Property at Tar Manufacturing Plant which, with the exception of two chests and their contents, belonged to the Partnership between Decedent and Sr. Aufrere.

By virtue of an order issued by Judge de Salmon on the petition of Sr. D'Auseville, Administrator of Vacant Successions, the parties, namely, Sr. Louis Joseph Bizoton, acting for Sr. Salmon; the Procurator General, the Administrator of Vacant Successions and the Clerk of Court repaired to the opposite side of the lake, to the tar manufacturing plant formerly owned in partnership by decedent and Antoine Aufrere and proceeded to take an inventory of the property located at that place.

In presence of Royal notaries at Brest, in Basse Bretagne diocese of Leon, appeared Messire Etienne de Perrier, Captain of the King's frigate, and Madame Catherine Le Chiblier, his spouse, on authorized requisition from her husband, to appear and act herein, who constitute as their procurator, general and special, Monsieur Louis Ferdinand of 14 salquen, Chevalier of Quertore, Lieutenant of the King's vessels, to whom the said Monsieur and Madame Perrier give full power and authority in their name, to sell, cede, and transfer, with good and sufficient guarantee, debt, mortgage, or other impediments whatever, to Monsieur Pradel, former Captain of Infantry, and to Sieur Guillaume Lange of New Orleans, the following:

A certain plantation belonging to said Perrier, situated in this city called "Monplaisir" with issues (roads) and dependencies belonging to said plantation, as well as negroes, negroes, negro children, cattle, sheep and horses without exception and according to inventory and census taken this present year by Monsieur Dubreuil. Total price - ninety five thousand livres for plantation to be paid in specie of either gold or silver, currency used as in France, which said purchasers obligate themselves by contract to pay to said vendors annually at their residence in Brest, until paid in full. The property inventoried consisted chiefly of a few pieces of household furniture and furnishings and clothing; one slave (a negress), the purchase price of whom is due the "company;" one half lot of ground on which there is a shanty; and one lot of ground on which there is the framework of a house.
