Answer of Sieur D'Auseville as Administrator of Vacant Successions, to petition of Claude Herpin, in the Succession of Sieur Baldic. Defendant alleges that of the two sums claimed, the sum of 202 livres, 10 sols, allegedly due on note of Baldic, should in all events be reduced to half the amount, as falling under the agreement entered into upon the retrocession of the India Company; and on the sum of 200 livres has been paid 46 livres, 5 sols. In addition defendant prays that a strict accounting be demanded of Herpin, who resided with decedent, of all effects, poultry, cattle, furniture, jewelry, and case of surgical instruments which belonged to decedent, defendant claiming that instead of being a creditor of said succession, plaintiff is a debtor thereof.
