Pursuant to a decree of Honorable de Salmon, issued on petition of Joseph Verret and Sieur Dumanoir, Agent of the Company of the Indies, creditor, Honorable Nicholas Chauvin de Lafreniere and the Clerk of Council with the Sheriff Lenormand, proceeded to the late Louis Claude Bailly's plantation five leagues from the city, to take an inventory and make an appraisement, in presence of the Attorney General of all lands, buildings, slaves, cattle, farm implements, tools, furniture, household goods, papers, accounts, receipts, deeds and promissory notes, belonging to the succession of the deceased Claude Bailly.

Petition of the Administrator
of Vacant Successions.

Sr. D'Auseville, in his said capacity, alleges that there has been rendered by the Superior Council a judgment in favor of Sr. Discon, condemning petitioner to pay to him for said succession the sum of 450 livres for a salary claim and that petitioner has satisfied said judgment.

Petitioner further alleges that it is not just to force the Succession to pay said salary, for the reason that it is a debt of the tar works partnership which existed between Sr. Aufrere and decedent; that said Sr. Aufrere managed the affairs of the partnership and usually received its profits, of which he has not yet given an accounting, and that the funds from which payment was made to Discon under the foregoing judgment were derived from the sale of effects other than those belonging to the tar works where Discon was employed, and that the only sum due him was for services rendered said partnership.

The future husband makes a marriage settlement on the future wife of 10,000 livres. A preciput of 3000 livres is agreed upon by the parties.
