The notary for the King repaired to a certain house belonging to Dame Arnaud, where testator resided, and where he found testator in bed, ill in body, but sound of mind.

After having recommended his soul to God and to the intercession of his patron saint, Calixte, testator requested the notary to read to him a certain will made by him on August 11, 1736. The notary read said will to the testator, who declared that it could not serve his purpose because of the change in his affairs.\*\*

Testator by these presents declares that he desires to be buried as simply as possible; that after payment of any sum he may owe to the Company of the Indies, the sum of 300 livres be given to the Parish Church for Masses or alms for the repose of his soul.

Testator desires that any profit due him on the crop of the current year, which he has grown, as usual, on the plantation of Sr. de Coustillas, be given to the poor of the city, in kind or in proceeds of sale.

He declares that he has given one of his cows to a negress named Catherine, belonging to Sr. de Coustillas, in recognition of faithful service. He desires that four head of cattle be delivered to the Company of the Indies, according to contract and he bequeaths eight head of cattle to Sr. de Coustillas.

Testator declared that he owns 5 negroes, 1 negress, 2 negro children and 1 Indian slave woman; that he desired Sr. Pery, in the absence of Sr. Coustillas (whom he names his testamentary executor) to sell said slaves and out of the proceeds to pay to the Company of the Indies testator's indebtedness, the balance to be delivered to said testamentary executor who shall remit same to Demoiselle Janon Descairac, sister of testator, or in the event she be dead, to Martial Descairac, their brother, residing at Acquillon, Parish of St. Cosme.

Testator declares that there are at his home another slave savagess and her children, who belonged to Sr. Neboul, who left them with testator on condition that he give them their liberty.

He bequeaths all of his remaining property, whether in this country, or in France if his father be dead, to the above named brother and sister, or in the event one of them be dead, to the survivor.
