

The family meeting decided that it would be to the advantage of the minor to sell said property to Sr. de Noyan, for 2200 livres, and to use said sum in the completion of the house in town, which was in the course of construction at the time of the death of decedent.

Petitioners allege that there was included in the property of the Succession a certain piece of ground situated at Chapitoulas and measuring 11 arpents front on the Mississippi River, which has little value, being without improvements; that the upkeep of levees in front of said property is very costly and that the land is subject to reversion to the public domain for want of cultivation.

Petitioners further allege that Sr. Delery left a lot of ground in the city, on which there stood, at the time of his death, a house in course of construction; and that the Succession has not sufficient funds on hand to have the house completed.

Petitioners further allege that a family meeting was convened in behalf of said minors, at which it was decided that it would be advantageous to their interests to sell the lands at Chapitoulas and to use the proceeds of sale to complete the construction of the house in New Orleans.

Wherefore petitioners pray for an order to sell said Chapitoulas land at public auction after compliance with formalities and to employ the proceeds in completing the house in town, under the direction of Sr. Broutin, Royal Engineer and Sr. DuBreuil, Contractor, whom the Court is asked to appoint in the matter.

The sale was made by order of Judge Salmon on the petition of Sr. J. B. Faucon Dumanoir, father and curator of Marie Faucon Dumanoir, minor, widow of decedent; and of the said Dame De Lery as tutrix to their minor son; and Sr. Belair, his under-tutor.

At the first crying of the property, the highest bidder was the Chevalier of Noyan, Major of New Orleans, for 600 livres.

At the second offering at auction, Sr. de Noyan was again the highest bidder, for 1000 livres.

At the third and final offering, the highest bid was again made by Sr. de Noyan, through Sr. Le Bretton, his agent and attorney in fact, and the property was finally adjudicated to him for 2200 livres, and costs of sale.

Sr. St. Julien during his lifetime had abandoned thirty arpents of land which he had purchased opposite Cannes Brulées. When his succession attempted to sell this land, De Lille Dupare claimed that he had bought a part thereof from various persons. Hence his bid for only 12 arpents.
