Thus this obligation was agreed upon at New Orleans, in the office of the Ordainer, Mr. Meric, and also in the presence of Silvestre de Troyer and Jean Bte. Laboulaye, witnesses here residing, who have signed:

Testator further declares that a certain 800 livre promissory note of Sr. Ferrand, which he held, has been lost, but that he has received several sums on account of same (as shown by itemized list of payments made and of bills paid therewith); that in the event said note be found it will be credited to the succession, only in the sum of 118 livres, representing the balance due by said Ferrand on said note.

After recommending his soul to God and to the intercession of St. Gerard, his patron saint, testator declared that he desired to be buried as simply as possible.

Testator names Sr. Pierre La Bat his testamentary executor, and declares that he desires said executor to take charge of and sell to the best advantage of Sr. Jung, merchant of Bordeaux, a cargo of merchandise shipped by him to testator which has not yet arrived in New Orleans, and to perform a similar office in the event other cargoes should be received after testator's death from any one whomsoever.

Testator desires that his said testamentary executor collect all debts due his succession, and particularly that he prosecute a certain suit against the Succession of Coustillas. Testator further directs said testamentary executor to consult Sr. Jahan in connection with the settling of his affairs.

Testator bequeaths to said Sr. Jahan a young negro boy, named Jaques, and declares that he does not desire said Sr. Jahan to be annoyed for payment of money due the Succession, until one year after testator's death, in order to give him time to settle his affairs.

Testator bequeaths all other property of which he may die possessed, either in this colony or elsewhere, to his mother, Dame Marie Davie Pery, residing at Bordeaux, France.
