Sr. Fleuriau, Procurator General, represents that relatives of Gabriel Jerosme Bosquet of Soissons, France, having requested him to inquire as to his fate, he accordingly wrote to a certain man who had come from Bosquet's country and who resides at Pointe Coupee, asking for news; that he has received the answer that Bosquet was killed by the Natchez Indians in the Yazoo Massacre, in the year 1729, when all buildings, including the church with its register, were burned, the Jesuit Father stationed there, as well as all officers and soldiers, had been massacred, and only one woman had escaped death, who would be the only person who could testify as to Bosquet's death; that there lived at Pointe Coupee "said Soissons" and Nicolas Bauche, who could testify as to the identify of the Gabriel Jerosme Bosquet who was on duty at Yazoo, but who had not witnessed the massacre.

The Procurator represents that while the statute of 1667 requires that death certificates be taken from church records, the great King who had it enacted could not have foreseen such utter destruction of human life and property, and in such emergency, the matter is left to the discretion of the Court.

Wherefore petitioner prays for an order to take depositions of persons who were acquainted with Bosquet and with the circumstances of his death; that the Procurator at Pointe Coupee be ordered to take deposition of Soissons; and that on account of the loss of the church register, it be ordered that the deposition of Reverend Father Doutrelon, Superior of the Jesuits, be taken covering the destruction of the Yazoo Post, the massacre of the Jesuit Father and all parishioners and the fact that only one woman escaped death.

He provides for the manumission of Jeanneton, a slave, and her little daughter, as a reward for faithful service, on the condition that she shall first serve two years after his death in the Hospital. He declares that said slave and her child are the joint property of his wife and himself, therefore that 1000 livres (1/2 of their value) should be deducted from the amount of his property which will fall to his wife. There is a further clause to the effect that said slaves shall be appraised by arbitration and the deduction made accordingly.

Testator names his brother, Amand Jaffre, who resides at Pimasson, in Agenois, his residuary legatee. In the event said Amand Jaffre should die before testator, his nephew (Amand Jaffre's

son) is named legatee, and a list of other relatives is given, covering such succeeding contingencies.
