The Procurator recommends that the account be approved on the condition that the slaves belonging to the community between decedent and Sr. Trepagnier and all property inventoried after the death of Sr. Trepagnier, be delivered to their co-heirs; that the co-heirs pay to Lassus Marsilly his share under his marriage contract with decedent; that he shall be discharged from responsibility of death of slaves of the community between himself and decedent; that the children born of the slaves be reputed the property of the second community and that Sr. Marsilly be charged with the sum of 6160 livres, proceeds of sale of real property, less 3000 livres belonging to the second community.

The Procurator further recommends that Sr. Marsilly's claim for 475 livres 5 sols 8 deniers for repairs be dismissed; that his claims for reimbursement of 500 livres paid Dame de

Judgment approving the account rendered by
plaintiff, on the following conditions:

That the five slaves who belonged to
the community which existed between de-
cedent and Sr. Trepagnier (or the proceeds
thereof, if they have been sold) be de-
livered to the co-heirs.

That the co-heirs shall pay to plaintiff
the share due him under his marriage con-
tract with decedent and that he shall be
discharged from any responsibility owing to
the deaths of any slaves who belonged to the
community between plaintiff and decedent.

That the children of the slaves belonging to said community, as well as the increase in cattle belonging thereto, shall be divided in the proportion of one-half to plaintiff and one-half to the co-heirs hereinabove mentioned.

That plaintiff shall be charged with the sum of 6150 livres realized from the sale of real estate, from which shall be deducted, however, the sum of 3000 livres, which is the valuation placed by the experts on a house built by plaintiff during his marriage with decedent; that said sum of 3000 livres shall be divided in the proportion of one-half to plaintiff and one-half to the co-heirs.

That the items of expense of plaintiff's account be held in abeyance until he shall have proven that he paid the 500 livres (100 piastres) to Dame de Vauberrey, for which he claims reimbursement; that the remaining items are all approved on condition that plaintiff submit proper vouchers verifying same.

BUILDING CONTRACT FOR SCHOOL
FOR THE POOR.

Personally appeared Messrs. Jean Baptiste Le Moyne de Bienville, Knight of the Military Order of St. Louis, Governor of the Province of Louisiana, and Edme Gaston Salmon, Councillor to the King, Commissioner of the Navy and First Judge of the Superior Council of the Province, of the first part,

And the Reverend Father Pierre, Superior of the Reverend Capuchin Fathers, apostolic missionary, priest and vicar of the Parish of New Orleans; Messrs. Claude Joseph Villars Du Breuil, and Raymond de St. Martin Jaurey Guiberry, churchwardens in charge of the Parish, of the second part,

Who, upon the proposal made by Sieur Gerard Pery, a merchant-tradesman of this city that it might please Sieurs Bienville and Salmon to grant him a building site on St. Ann Street, (which was formerly dedicated to a school for the poor, the house on which is now in ruins, as well as the surrounding property, in exchange for which the said Pery proposed to cause to be built a substantial house, to be used as a school on a lot of ground which Sieurs Bienville and Salmon, the Reverend Capuchin Father, and the wardens of the church shall judge proper, proceed as follows: the Reverend Father, assisted by the wardens in charge now abandon for the public welfare a suitable site on the plot, whereon to build the said house to be used as a school. Messrs. Bienville and Salmon, already vested with His Majesty's authority, have granted and assigned to the said Sieur Pery the site fronting on St.

Ann Street, on the lot of the rectory, adjoining his property on the side of the square, the property of the Riviere heirs on the other side, and in the rear the property of Sr. Carron; the said Sr. Pery to have and enjoy full ownership of said lot under the clauses and condition that he cause to be built at his own expense on the lot of the said rectory, on the site marked on the plan, a building which shall be entirely of brick, thirty feet long on the inside. The wall shall extend sixteen inches beyond the foundation, up to the spot where the framework shall be placed, and shall be $14\frac{1}{2}$ feet in width, or more if the situation and lot permit, on the inside. The two gable ends shall be squared. There shall also be six windows of wrought masonry in the said school, as shown on the plan, and these shall be walled to a height that will not permit the pupils to see above them into the street. These windows shall have shutters. There shall be one chimney; one front door; two writing tables and the entire circumference of the school encircled by a bench. The upper construction shall be as indicated on plan. The roof shall be of shingles. There shall be only six rafters, which shall take the place of small joists, as there shall be no boards. The said building to be built and completed until surrender of keys, as indicated on plan, which shall remain annexed to the original of these presents and form part hereof.

Also the Sieur Pery shall have built a small enclosure of pickets stuck in the ground which shall shut off the front door of the school and serve the purpose of a small yard, as indicated on the plan. The whole to be good and substantial, built and finished, and subject to inspection. The proposed building to be completed entirely during the course of next year, 1741, at the latest.

In view of which engagements made by Sr. Pery, Messrs. de Bienville and de Salmon, the Rev. Father Superior and the church wardens in charge, have consented and do hereby consent to the said exchange, said Sr. Pery, his heirs and assigns to have and to hold said lot of ground undisturbed and in full ownership. It is further agreed that the school shall be dedicated to the poor, which establishment could not otherwise exist for lack of a building.

To secure the performance of his obligations Sr. Pery mortgages all his property, movable and immovable, and particularly the lot of ground herein ceded, agreeing that the full ownership thereof shall not vest in him until completion by him of said building.
