The Widow Avarre, after being duly sworn, declared that, to the best of her knowledge, neither a part nor the whole of the property inventoried had ever been tampered with since the death of her husband.

Accordingly, Marin Lenormant was the sheriff appointed to make an appraisal of the property inventoried.
